- A. provide new, high-interest, and popular circulating materials
 - print and digital formats of books and periodicals
 - audio-visual in multiple formats
 - take-home technologies
 - Beyond Books collection
- B. maintain easily accessible resources
 - public access computers
 - free public Wi-Fi connection
 - copy, scan, and fax services
 - in-house use of materials
 - database access on in-house computers and select at-home login

- develop partnerships with local businesses
- recruit community residents and organizations to share expertise
- promote local historical programs
- provide or host local author events

OBJECTIVES & ACTIVITIES:

- A. provide educational and recreational opportunities for families and children from birth to age 14
 - structured, passive, and technology programs
 - activity centers, in-library activities, interactive environment
 - outreach visits to pre-k, elementary, and middle schools
 - community service/volunteer hours
- B. provide educational and recreational support to young adults as they transition through high school to adulthood
 - programs targeted to teen interests and gaining life-skills
 - outreach visits to middle and high schools
 - community service/volunteer hours
- C. provide informational and recreational opportunities to a general audience or adults
 - health, safety, and wellness programs
 - cultural, social, and enlightening programs
 - book, writers, and crafting clubs and groups
 - local and regional history programs and displays
 - minimum of 2 large-scale library events per year
 - outreach events in the community
- D. provide informational and recreational support to older adults as they transition to retirement and beyond
 - social interaction and mind-engaging activities
 - comfortable and welcoming spaces
 - customized technology classes

expand the use and understanding of technology

OBJECTIVES & ACTIVITIES:

- A. provide access opportunities for circulating technologies
 - increase Wi-Fi hotspots
 - investigate e-readers or tablets
 - expand Beyond Books collection
- B. create technology enriched spaces to support collaborative learning and networking
 - provide computers in study and meeting rooms
 - provide power-friendly furniture
 - install informative display screens
 - investigate expansion of computer training space
- C. provide technology classes at multiple ability levels
 - basic technology for children
 - teen-focused technology
 - beginner level for inexperienced users
 - intermediate level for mid-level users
 - advanced level for high-level users
- D. integrate library databases into educational opportunities
 - create public programs introducing how-to-use select databases
 - incorporate databases as additional resources in general programs
 - implement database training modules for library staff

administer exceptional operational and fiscal management

OBJECTIVES & ACTIVITIES:

- A. provide the community with qualified and professional staff
 - minimum educational requirements for positions
 - staff technology core competencies
 - State mandatory and additional training opportunities
 - emergency procedures training and documentation
- B. assure expenditures for services provide the best quality for an affordable price
 - review and assess contracts for service needs, quality, and cost
 - comparison shop and consolidate purchases to decrease costs
- C. investigate supplemental revenues for the operating budget
 - submit annual application for the State of Illinois Per Capita Grant
 - explore additional grant opportunities
 - consider additional revenue streams
- D. maintain system-wide procedures to strengthen internal controls
 - cash and check handling, collection, and deposits
 - digital network security
 - facility security
 - performance statistics
