NEW & UPCOMING AT OLPL

We've been working hard at OLPL to refresh and upgrade your Library over the past year, and we're not done yet! Upgrades in 2025 include the Drive-up Window for you to pick up your holds from the convenience of your vehicle; a new central location for the Friends Bookstore; a crisp look in the Local History Area; the refreshed looks of Study Rooms 1, 2 and 3; and a new color scheme in our lower-level Meeting Rooms. We've even added new display cases on the main level to highlight more local history and personal collections of community members.

If you've been inside the Library recently, you may have noticed that the northwest corner has been under construction. This new Encore Room will be the future home for Senior programming at OLPL. There may still be an occasional need to host larger programs in the lower level, but the Encore Room will allow Seniors to participate in a new space, without the need to take the stairs or the elevator to a program. The room will also be equipped with Hearing Loop technology, channeling the room's audio content directly to most hearing aids. We expect the room to be ready for programming use in late December or early January.

In the works for 2026 will be additional upgrades for Study Rooms 4, 5 and 6; new public service desks; and a new Library website!



COMMUNITY DISPLAY CASE SUBMISSIONS ARE OPEN

OLPL is proud to offer an opportunity for local community groups, organizations and individuals to display their art, exhibits and more to our patrons! OLPL's Community Display Cases, found across from the AV Collection in the lobby, may be used to exhibit special collections, handicrafts, activities and creative works. Display cases have four shelves and measure 72 inches wide x 20 inches deep x 60 inches high. Shelves have a weight limit of 20 pounds each.

All submissions must follow guidelines found on www.olpl.org/display-cases/ and are subject to approval of the Marketing Manager. Submitters will be contacted by the Library if their submission is chosen. Approval to display materials does not constitute sponsorship or endorsement by the Library. Patrons are responsible for their display's setup when this period begins, as well as its retrieval when it concludes.

Exhibits for the Community Display Cases will be selected and scheduled on a first come-first serve basis as is fitting to the Library's operations. Selected collections will be placed on display for three months, coinciding with the Library's programming seasons. Either or both Community Display Cases may be unavailable for a given season due to use by the Library.

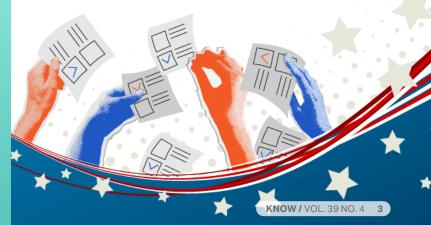

ROLL OUT AND TAKE A SWING AT VIRTUAL BOWLING!

When was the last time you went bowling? For some, it could be a week ago. For others, it could be decades. No matter when you last hit the lanes, the Byte-Sized Bowling session of our Senior programming series Who's Got Game is accessible to both seasoned bowlers and complete newcomers. Nintendo designed a simple, robust bowling video game for their Switch console that utilizes their motion controls to make the act of throwing a ball down the lane possible for practically anyone. Essentially all one has to do is hold a small lightweight remote, hold one button down and swing your arm like it's the real deal. While it is very easy to pick up and learn, it doesn't just play itself. Your fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination and timing will be needed to go from 7-10 splits to strikes. If you're up for pushing a bit out of your comfort zone with an encouraging group of enthusiastic peers, then Byte-Sized Bowling is a great place for you! 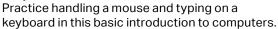
